
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


VICTORY CONDITIONS: The side with the most unbroken squads (not crews) in any hex of building 1Z7 at the end of play wins. The Russian wins if both have an equal number.

Stalingrad, October 20, 1942: A small Russian force occupied a damaged apartment building on Lenin Square. The strong point came under heavy German attack on 20 October, as part of the general effort to complete German seizure of the city.

BOARD CONFIGURATION:





SSR OAF 35.1.1: TERRAIN: Wheatfields are not in effect.

SSR OAF 35.1.2: The Russian player has control of all of the stone buildings at the start of the scenario.

SSR OAF 35.1.3: SIDE SELECTION PROCEDURE: Each player takes one marker of each nationality and simultaneously reveals their choice of side. If opposing sides are selected, those sides are assigned. If the same side is chosen, the players bid for side with the lower rated (seed) player bidding first. Bids may start at '0' and progress in whole numbers only. The bid is the numbers of dominate squads to be added to the opposing side. The bid continues until one player accepts the opposing side whose force is augmented with that bid
